

Homework is defined as an important and relevant learning activity that is related to the school program, and that takes place in a variety of settings in the home or in the community. The purpose of homework is to support the learning process and enhance the educational growth of the student.

The Board of Trustees believes that homework is a partnership and a cooperative effort between home and school involving parents, teachers and students. Homework gives each student the opportunity to develop important skills, acquire new knowledge and consolidate and reinforce learning in practical and meaningful ways.

Each school shall develop local homework guidelines. For the guidelines to be effective, school staff should have a clear understanding of the purpose of homework in their school and be able to articulate their school's homework guidelines to students and parents.
